THE PIECRIMS WAY

Tracing its route along the base of the North Downs. the Pilgrims' Way follows the course of the Old Road - perhaps the first recognised trunk road in Britain. Its route from Winchester to Canterbury means most of it has either disappeared under a blanket of tarmac or been barricaded behind a wall of 'private' signs, but in the middle of Kent there's a stretch which remains much as it was in the days when it was still a bustling thoroughfare.

This forms the backbone of a route which winds its way up and down the chalky downland that characterises an area which, more than any other part of Kent, is redolent of the county's nickname of the 'Garden of England.' Most of the time, you'll be picking your way along well surfaced farm tracks and field edges, though by turns you'll be pushing through dense woodland while wincing at the sound of undergrowth scratching at your paintwork.

Your route includes a clutch of the county's picturesque villages, too. Kent is not short of unliness. but there's little sign of it here - even though much of the time you'll be within a mile or so of both the M20 and the Channel Tunnel railway.

You wouldn't think it. With great views across the Weald and lots to keep drivers and navigators entertained, this is a pretty, peaceful drive and a perfect way to get away from it all for a few hours in one of the busiest parts

USING TULIP DIAGRAMS

STICK TO THE ROUTE!

When using green lanes, you must ALWAYS stick to the right of way. NEVER drive off on to the verges or surrounding land. It's illegal, it's damaging and lanes are constantly being closed because of it. Playdays are for playing lanes are for laning!

For various dull reasons, we've had to delay the roadbook we've been planning in South-West Wales. In the meantime, this is a revised version of the route that appeared back in September 2002, in the first ever issue of Total Off Road

Since then, illegal obstructions have become a problem at Step 37. At the time of writing, the lane is clear, but you may need to navigate around it. The very next lane after that at Step 38, is currently subject to an experimental permit scheme being run by the local authority: sadly, this was deemed necessary because of people trashing it in wet weather and, to the shame of all 4x4 drivers, using the war memorial next to it (a cross carved into the chalk down) as a playground.

Thus, before using the lane, you need to apply for permission by calling Kent County Council on 08458 247 247. You're also asked not to use the lane at all in wet conditions, and should be aware that the lane will be closed to all traffic for a spell this spring while the grass surface grows back following repair.



DRIVING ON RIGHTS OF WAY

- A Keep your speed right down
- A Pull over to let walkers, bikers and horse riders pass
- Don't travel in large convoys. More than about six vehicles, and you should split into smaller groups to avoid hassling other users
- A Leave gates as you found them
- A Don't drop litter
- Fords are not there for washing your vehicle
- A Fix that oil leak before you go
- Mud is not a playground
- Scrupulously obey all closure and voluntary restraint notices
- Don't cause a noise nuisance, particularly after dark
- Ensure you have a right to be there. We research the routes on our roadbooks very carefully, but the status of any route can change without notice
- Be prepared to turn back if the route is blocked, even illegally
- If you find an illegal obstruction, notify the local authority
- If someone challenges you, be polite and stay calm. If you're driving sensibly on a public highway or byway, they don't have a leg to stand on
- If someone gives you abuse (it does happen, though much less frequently than some laners' tales might make you think), don't give it back
- Stick absolutely scrupulously to the right of way





